New Media Decoding Lessons:

Paul Revere's Midnight Ride

Upper Elementary & Middle School

Students analyze Paul Revere's account of his midnight ride, Longfellow's poem and a YouTube video to consider context and sourcing in recounting an historic event.



- How are these depictions of Paul Revere's ride similar and different?
- Is this a primary or secondary document? How can you tell?
- How does it help to have descriptions of historical events by different sources to explain events in the past?

The Boston Massacre: A Bloody Slaughter or Self Defense?

Middle & High School

Students analyze Paul Revere's engraving, a newspaper account by the British commander, a deposition by an eyewitness, and court testimony to learn about sourcing, bias, and credibility in historical sources.

- What knowledge do you need to fully understand this? How do you find that out?
- Reflecting on all 4 documents, which side do you think initiated the Massacre and why?
- What has this lesson taught you about judging credibility of historical sources based on media source, intended audience and purpose?



